October Meeting Minutes

We purchased a PJ 32 foot heavy equipment trailer for the dozer.

Rod Vollmer and Gary Stone were appointed as the official voting delegates for the SARM Mid-Term convention to be held in November.

Dwayne Stamnes attended the CAT M series motor grader Operator Training being offered by Kramer Ltd.

Kevin Vollmer, Brain Brown and Donald Chernick will attend the Building Standards Workshop In Elbow in November.

We will build up the road along the west boundary of the NW 21-26-06 W3M conditional to subdivision approval and commencement of construction.

The Reeve signed the new CTP Agreement for our Clear the Path route.

That In consultation with the Village of Elbow and Tom and Rick Jukes we pursue the signing of the road currently known as "Jukes Road". The costs for the signing will be the responsibility of the Jukes Subdivision.

The municipality's scoring system for allocation of Crown land leases for 2010 is: Distance – 5 points; Age – 7 points; Resource Base – 3 points.

October Meeting Highlights cont.

Manager of Special Projects of North Ridge Developments Corporation met with council to discuss sewage/lagoon options for their proposed development of the Garth Subdivision. A partnered project is now being considered by the municipality.

We will tender for sale the following: 1 Gardner lowboy trailer, 1 single axle converter and 1 Autotran ditch swather. Tenders will be received until November 16th.

November Meeting Highlights

We accept the delegates' reports of the SARM Mid Term Convention and pay the delegate's and Administrator's expense.

That we accept the fall rat inspection report submitted from Ron Savidan.

That we notify Enbridge of road damage to the Cutbank grid at SE13-27-07 and request they come to inspect it.

That we appoint Garry Book to act as Deputy Reeve for the balance of 2010 and 2011.

That the Reeve or the Deputy Reeve and the Administrator be authorized to sign cheques and other municipality documents on behalf of the municipality.

The office will be closed from December 20-28 inclusive for Xmas.

The local snow plow clubs and individuals be granted permission to plow snow on municipal roads on condition to the regulations of the Contractor's Agreement exempting operators from regulations under the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 be signed and deposited with the office.

We tender the following: 75,000 cubic yards of type 108 traffic gravel and 2500 cubic yards of type 102 stabilization gravel. Tenders close on Jan 4, 2011.

That we form a policy that all roads built to engineered standard be bored and not cut out when contractors need to cross these roads.

We will grant permission to the Village of Hawarden to register their P25 radio equipment for their fire department on our radio license and frequency.

That we apply for funding for the Loreburn Rink addition energy efficient items under the New Deals for Cities and Communities grant.

We will renew our membership for 2011 in the Lake Diefenbaker Tourism Inc.

We allow SK Watershed Authority to register a Notice of Issuance of an Approval of Works for the work project on the SW 12-25-05 W3M.

We approve the subdivision of Parcel A on the SE 06-26-04 W3M as it is in compliance with our zoning Bylaw NO. 02/1998 5.32.2 and Section 4.4.2 of the Basic Planning Statement No.01/98.

We donate \$100.00 gift certificate for Custom Work to the Loreburn Travel Club 2011 for their Live and Silent Auction.

December Meeting Minutes

That we pay the water and loan arrears presented by the Cutbank Rural Water Pipeline and Line 19 Water Pipeline and these arrears be applied to and become part of the municipal taxes of each subscriber in arrears.

Any outstanding custom work arrears be applied to each landowners municipal taxes.

That council indemnity rates and mileage remain the same for 2011.

That we pay the Villages of Hawarden and Loreburn the \$800.00 fire agreements and increase the amount already paid to Elbow by \$300.00.

We pay the Villages of Hawarden, Strongfield and Elbow \$1,000.00 and the Village of Loreburn \$3,000.00 as recreation grants for 2010.

That the Village of Loreburn can register their P25 radio equipment for their fire department on our radio license and VIH frequency.

That 1/3 of the moneys paid to Reeve and Councillors be allotted as expense under the Income Tax Act.

That we take out membership in the Hudson Bay Route Association for 2011 at a rate of \$300.00.

That we fund the Elbow Library for 33% of the extra opening and Loreburn Library for 66.66 %, our share being \$2024.80.

That we approve the proposed subdivision on the NW 29-26-04 W3M .

We will donate \$100.00 to the Ronald McDonald House.

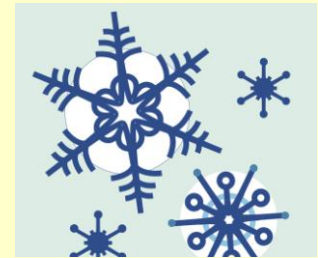
Bylaw No. 03-2010 being a bylaw to amend No. 07/05 known as the Public Policy Bylaw be adopted.

SARM Mid-Term Convention Highlights

Reeve Kevin Vollmer and councilors Brian Brown, Rod Vollmer, Garry Book and Garry Stone attended Mid-Term Convention in November, 2010.

Officials from the Ministry of Environment, SK Watershed Authority & Oceans and Fisheries Canada gave a presentation on rules and regulations regarding drainage. The SK Pulse Growers and the SK Soil Conservation Assn. made a presentation on SK climate change legislation. Bob Bjornerud, Minister of Agriculture, announced the Sk Feed and Forage program to support livestock and forage producers affected by excess moisture. As well he announced that SK producers will not be eligible for compensation for crop and forage damage caused by wild animals, beavers and blackbirds starting in the 2011 crop year. Morgan Powell, Reeve of the RM of Miry Creek was elected as one of the two rural representatives to the SAMA board. Dale Harvey, SARM CEO gave a presentation on Succession Planning and the Municipal Administrator Internship Program (MAIP).

Thirty-two resolutions were debated with 28 resolutions carried. The passed resolutions are posted on the SARM website at www.sarm.ca
